(1) Duties and Rewards

In order to advise members in Cao Bang to work more, the Tong bo V.M. has sent some medals (silver V.M. star) to reward to the places which are the best in accomplishing duties, it is called "the reward on occasions".

1. How to Give the Rewards?

(a) the places where there are good organizations, which is to say these are all kinds of organizations: Ass. of N.S., of the old, peasants, women, youth, pioneers and self-defence units.

(b) the places where there are most-developed organizations which is to say they have more members.

(c) the places where there are the best trainings, which is to say members ~~get~~ ^{better} military training, political training, ^{more} national language lessons ^{and} newspapers to read than other places.

(d) the places where duties are accomplished at best, which is to say the propaganda, organization and support to the newspaper are better than other places.

2. Why is it called "the reward on occasions"? On occasions means from this place to other, not the same place.

3. Who will keep the reward? The best village or commune of the rewarded district.

4. Old ~~prov~~ district and new district: If the A district is long-organized, and B is newly-organized, so A must be bigger than B. So will A keep the reward for long? No, B will be given the reward in this case. For example, this month A has 500 members, B has 100. But next month A has 50 more new members (1/10) and B has 20 more (2/10), and B will be rewarded, because B is better.

5. Significance of the Reward: It is aimed at encouraging us to work.
